



60+ PROGRAM

The 60+ Program is a fee waiver program available to qualified persons who are California residents and are sixty (60) years of age or older. The program is designed to encourage this constituency group to enroll in regular session courses on a space available basis at a reduced rate.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible, you must be at least 60 years of age and have met the California residency requirements. Both undergraduate and post baccalaureate students may participate.

REGISTRATION FOR CLASSES

All regular classes (day and evening) will be available for possible enrollment at a reduced fee on a space available basis.

FEE

Under the 60+ Program, fees for the semester are reduced to \$11.00 per semester.

NOTE: Students are responsible for paying full costs associated with books parking, lab/supply fees, and any other student fees not covered through the waiver. Students wishing to park on campus must pay the quarterly or daily parking fee.

HOW TO APPLY:

Option 1: Non-Degree Seeking - If you are interested in taking course for enrichment purposes only and do not wish to pursue a degree, you should complete the Special Programs Application for 60+ Program. You will need to apply each semester for this program. Completed applications are accepted by the Office of Admissions & Records in person. You must submit

- Paper application;
- Fee waiver and;
- California Driver's License or Identification Card.

Option 2: Degree Seeking - Under this plan, you will be applying for general admission as a degree candidate, therefore, you should complete an online application at calstate.edu/apply during the application filing period. Students seeking a degree will need to meet general admissions requirements for admissions.

As part of the application process, you will need to submit official transcripts from all colleges or universities you have previously attended. If your former school is no longer in existence, the records may have been transferred to the local public school or the area Board of Education for maintenance. Hand carried transcripts will be accepted if they remain in the original officially sealed envelope. You do not need to repeat the application process after the first semester if you maintain continuous enrollment at CSU Bakersfield.
