Glenn and Dorothy Dumke Fellowship - FAH (Vol. 6, No. 29)

Students are advised that the Glenn and Dorothy Dumke Fellowship has been established in memory of Dr. Glenn S. Dumke, Chancellor of the California State University from 1962 to 1982. Dr. Dumke died at home on July 29, 1989.

Chancellor Dumke was born in Green Bay, Wisconsin in 1917. He received his B.A. and M.A. degrees at Occidental College and his Ph.D. at UCLA. He also held honorary degrees from nine other distinguished universities across the country. In 1940, Dr. Dumke began his 22-year career in higher education as an instructor of history at Occidental College. He went on to become a professor of history and Dean of the faculty at Occidental before becoming President of San Francisco State College in 1957. While serving as President, Dr. Dumke was one of the principal architects of The Master Plan for Higher Education in California, which became the blueprint for the State's higher education system. Under Dr. Dumke's leadership, the University system made great progress in the breadth and quality of academic programs. As a later CSU Chancellor said, "He organized 16 separate academic programs into a single system that became a model across the nation... it happened because Dr. Dumke was a visionary leader."

The purpose of the fellowship is to encourage student scholars to engage in graduate work in fields such as public policy, American history, economics, archival management and government. A strong emphasis must be indicated by the applicants as to how these fields relate to the State of California. The winning scholars are expected to pursue research projects within special CSU library/archival collections.

One fellowship of up to \$1,000 will be awarded for the 2005-2006 academic year using the stated criterion:

- Applicant must be in good standing and have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Applicant must be a CSU graduate student in the areas of public policy, American history, economics, archival management, or government during the 2005-2006 academic year.
- All or part of the award shall be used to pursue research projects within special CSU library or archival collections, such as the Dumke Collection and other collections housed within the CSU archives at CSU Dominguez Hills, the Center for California Studies at CSU Sacramento, or others within the CSU system.

The Financial Aid Office at each campus will forward applications to the CSU Chancellor's Office for review. Applications must include the application form, statement from the applicant, letter of recommendation, and copy of transcripts. Please refer to the application for more information.

The deadline for submission of all scholarship application materials to the CSU Chancellor's Office is Monday, May 2, 2005
