HACU National Internship Program - FAH (Vol. 7, No. 20)

Students are advised that the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (HACU) recruits college students for summer- and semester-long *paid* internships at federal agencies and private corporations in Washington, D.C. and throughout the country. These ten- and fifteen-week internship programs are designed to allow college students to gain professional development experience that will enable them to make educated career choices.

TRAVEL EXPENSES:

Roundtrip airfare is arranged and provided at no charge to interns when applicable. Federal interns who arrange their own transportation will be reimbursed for reasonable expenses. (Note: Expenses must be pre-approved.)

STIPENDS:

Government intern stipend levels are based on academic level *at the time of application*.
Sophomore/Junior - \$440/week • Senior - \$470/week • Graduate/Law - \$540/week
Corporate intern pay levels vary and will be determined at the time of the offer.

ELIGIBILITY:

All applicants must:

- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Be currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program
- Have completed their freshman year of college before the internship begins
- Be authorized or eligible to work by law in the United States

APPLICATION DEADLINES:

Spring 2006 deadline is November 4, 2005; Summer 2006 deadline is February 24, 2006; Fall 2006 deadline is June 16, 2006.

HOW TO APPLY:

To be considered for an internship, apply online at <http://www.hnip.net>. You will also need to mail the following documents:

1. Current official transcript **and**
2. Certification of Enrollment Form

Applicants are screened and selected based on their field of study, goals, academic performance, and extracurricular activities. Supervisors at participating federal agencies or corporations make the final selections; however, HACU makes the official offer of employment to the student.
