Department Information:

The Department of Computer Science is one of seven departments in the School of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. The department consists of eight full-time members. One of these faculty shares a joint appointment with the Department of Mathematics; one shares a joint appointment with the Department of Physics/Geology. The department offers a full complement of courses for the baccalaureate degree as well as service courses. It administers its own local area network including servers, a Unix workstation lab, and two linux PC labs. The Computer Science department has just moved into a new 3-storey building (Spring 2008). This building gives the Department of Computer Science almost 20,000 square feet of much needed office, machine room, classroom, hardware and software lab space.

General Information:

California State University, Bakersfield, founded in 1970, is one of twenty-three campuses of the CSU System and currently has an enrollment of 7,500 students. The University services a socially and ethnically diverse population of 560,000 in an area of 10,000 square miles. The city of Bakersfield (population over 300,000) is located in the southern San Joaquin Valley and has a much lower cost of living than coastal California. Los Angeles, the Pacific Ocean, Mojave Desert, and Sierra Nevada Mountains are all within a two-hour drive from campus.
