

Admission Requirements

A candidate must have a Degree: BA, BS, or MA.

If you have not completed your degree, you must request a grad check from your evaluator in the Admission and Records office. Once you receive your grad check, you must provide a copy to the appropriate evaluator for your file.

Admission criteria are based on the CSU and CCTC guidelines. They include, but are not limited to, the following:

Grade Point Average (GPA): To be considered for regular admission, you must have a 2.67 overall GPA, or 2.75 GPA in the last 90 quarter units/60 semester units.

Exceptional Admission: If you feel that you have a reason to be considered for Exceptional Admission due to not meeting one or more of the admission requirements, you must complete and submit the Exceptional Admit Request form which is included in the application packet.

CBEST: All candidates must take the California Basic Education Skills Test before applying to the program. Proof of passing CBEST must be submitted at the time of application to Stage III Student Teaching. For more information see: www.cbest.nesinc.com.

CSET: All candidates must pass the California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET– Multiple Subjects, subtest I, II & III) before admission to the program. Contact the Testing Center at 654-3373 for the last date acceptable prior to the admission deadline. For more information see: www.cset.nesinc.com

Fingerprint Clearance: Certificate of Clearance, Emergency or Substitute permit issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

Tuberculin Clearance (TB): Valid within the last four years.

Candidate Evaluations: Included in the application packet.

Oral Interview: You will sign up for a scheduled interview during the Group Application and Information Meeting.

Writing Sample: This will be completed at the end of the Group Application and Information Meeting..

Your application must be complete for consideration for admission to the Credential Program.

A minimum GPA of 3.00 in all education coursework must be maintained while in the MSCP. If you earn a grade lower than a "C-", you must retake the course before taking any other coursework. You will not be admitted to Student Teaching until your GPA is 3.00 or better. If your education GPA falls below 3.00, you will be placed on academic probation, disqualified from the program and/or will not be recommended for a credential. Applying for Your Credential

To apply for a Preliminary Credential, the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing requires the following:

1. **A BA/BS degree from an accredited University.**
2. **Passage of the CSET exam.**
3. **Passage of CBEST exam.**
4. **Passage of the RICA exam.**
5. **A course in US Constitution**
6. **Completion of CTAP 1 Region 8 or school district workshop**
7. **Completion of an accredited teacher preparation program, including supervised student teaching.**
8. **CPR— Infant, Child & Adult**
9. **Assessment Portfolio**

Program Overview

The SB 2042 Multiple Subject Credential Program (MSCP) is a state–approved professional preparation program to earn

a credential for teaching multiple subjects in a self-contained classroom. Teachers with this credential traditionally teach elementary (K-8) grades.

This brochure provides an overview of the program requirements. Our program is designed to accommodate the needs of both full-time and part-time students. With very careful planning, full-time students can complete the program in an academic year. Day, evening and some Saturday courses are available. Daytime fieldwork in public elementary school settings is required for certain courses.

If you are not currently a student at CSUB or if you are a graduating senior, you must apply to the university for admission as a post baccalaureate student. When completing the application, be sure to indicate that your objective is “credential.” Specify “multiple subjects” and the code “200” in the appropriate place on the application.
