### SECONDARY EDUCATION SB2042 PROGRAM

The School of Education submitted its new SB 2042 program last August and is awaiting the CCTC review outcome. The new program under review entered the implementation phase in the Winter Quarter 2004. Candidates admitted prior to Winter 2004 will continue with the AB1059 traditional program as outlined on their advising sheets. However, some SB 2042 courses are equivalent to traditional credential courses; the enclosed chart will indicate which SB2042 courses can be substituted for AB1059 traditional courses. Students must register for the CBEST, submit Proof of Live Scan, a Certificate of Clearance or Emergency Permit, and proof of negative TB test results in order to be admitted Winter 2005 quarter. Candidates admitted for the Winter 2005 quarter will be required to attend an advising session with Mrs. Multanen to outline their credential program of study before enrolling in your Winter quarter 2005 courses.

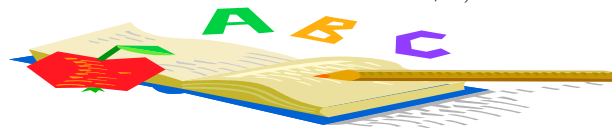

### IMPORTANT GPA REQUIREMENTS

You must maintain a GPA of 3.0 in the credential courses. Students whose GPA falls below 3.0 will be placed on probation for one quarter or be dropped drop from the Secondary Education program.

## **INTERN REQUIREMENTS**

- You are employed as a teacher in a public school district, which has an Intern Agreement with the KCSOS Consortium
- You are admitted to CSUB and the Single Subject Credential Program
- You hold a BA degree and have passed CBEST
- You are 100% Subject Matter Competent
- You have completed a US Constitution course or exam
- You have a Certificate of Clearance or an Emergency Permit

**PLEASE NOTE: YOU MUST REGISTER FOR THE COURSE AND ATTEND ALL SIMINARS**

## **Student Teaching**

**Effective Fall Quarter 2004, you must be 100% Subject Matter Competent (SMC) to Student Teach**, and have completed & turned in a Student/ Intern teaching request form to Eric Anderson by the fifth week of the quarter **NO EXCEPTIONS!!!** You must possess the following qualifications to do student teaching. If you do not meet these qualifications, **DO NOT APPLY FOR STUDENT TEACHING** at this time.

Qualifications for student teaching are:

- Subject matter competency (Passage of C-SET, SSAT/Praxis E.T.P.P. students must be 100 % SMC)
- Current TB clearance (good for 4 years)
- Certificate of Clearance OR Emergency Permit. You must have your Certificate of Clearance OR Emergency Permit from CTC before you can student teach. Please take care of this requirement immediately (**Live scans will not meet this requirement**).
- Completion of Stage I, II, and III courses for Stage IV student teaching
- Register for student teaching on-line (If there is problems with registration please contact the S.O.E. office immediately).
- Has had an Interview & Advising Appointment, and have a complete Credential file.

You will need to attend the student teaching orientation seminar. At this orientation seminar, you will meet your Supervisor. This is a mandatory meeting and roll will be taken. There is no excuse for missing this meeting. **Please be considerate! Do not complete a placement form if you will not be able to student teach for the quarter requested. If you change your mind, please notify Eric immediately. If you do not meet the qualifications, do not apply until all requirements have been met.**

## **Advising**

Program advisors are available for advising at the CSUB/A.V. office by appointment. PLEASE CALL Amelia at **952-5080** TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT. **Newly admitted students (2004/2005)** must meet with an advisor prior to Stage 1 to complete a program plan.

## **Measles, Mumps, and Rubella Immunization**

CSU requires all students born after January 1, 1957 to either be immunized after 15 months of age or present laboratory verification of MMR immunity. You will be allowed to enroll for your first quarter without any restrictions; however before you can register for the second quarter at CSUB you will be required to have your immunization. ### New Requirements

NON-DEGREE POST BACCALAUREATE STUDENTS (CREDENTIAL CANDIDATES) ARE NOT REQUIRED TO PASS AN UPPER DIVISION WRITING COURSE OR EXAMINATION. HOWEVER, A **CREDENTIAL CANDIDATE MUST PASS THE CBEST WITH AN OVERALL SCORE OF 123 OR HIGHER.**

### INTERVIEWS

**ALL STUDENTS** being admitted for and after **Fall QUARTER 2004** will have to complete an interview before a panel of Faculty members. This has to be completed before you can be accepted to the Credential program. Please call the S.O.E. office to schedule an appointment immediately (661) 952-5080. ### CSET/SSAT/Praxis Information

Beginning January 25, 2003, the CSET (California Subject Examinations for Teachers) will replace the SSAT/Praxis exams in the areas of **English, Math, and ALL Sciences**. If you have already passed the exams, you will not have to take the new test. If you have had partial success on the exams, you will be provided with three final opportunities to earn the required passing scores. ### HOT OFF THE PRESS

Effective Spring 2004 quarter, the following revised course overload policy will take effect:

- ✓ All students may enroll up to 17 units.
- ✓ A full-time student with a CUSB grade point average of 3.5 or better may carry a maximum of 20 units.
- ✓ For continuing CSUB students, loads in excess of established maximums may be permitted by petition to the appropriate dean.
- ✓ Course loads in excess of 17 units are not permitted for CSUB students during their first quarter.

Candidates are required to adhere to the 17-unit restriction for each quarter unless immediate requirements for their preliminary credential program dictate an overload petition. If this applies to you, you must fill out an Overload Petition Form and submit it to the SOE Dean, for review. Submit your Overload Petition to Dr. Gibbons, and she will forward it to the Dean. In this case, the SOE Dean may approve up to 20 units; in urgent cases that involve a 20 unit overload, an overload petition must be approved by the Vice President of Academic Affairs, Dr. Ed Sasaki.
