AVAILABILITY, LOCATION, AND METHODS TO SUMMON LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE

Enforcement and Arrest Authority

The California State University, Bakersfield (CSUB) Police Department is located at 9001 Stockdale Hwy, Bakersfield, CA, Building 60 and provides police services 24 hours a day to our community. Police Dispatch can be reached directly 24 hours a day by phone at 661-654-2677.

The peace officers of CSUB have state-wide police authority and jurisdiction per Penal Code 830.2 and Education Code 89560, and are vested with law enforcement powers and responsibilities, identical to the local police or sheriff departments in your home community.

Crime Reporting

The entire campus community is strongly encouraged to report any and all known or suspected incidents of criminal activity on campus to the University Police Department as soon as possible. When calling CSUB Police always:

- Give your name, telephone number, and location.
- Give clear and accurate information.
- Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description, and direction of travel.
- DON'T HANG UP! Follow the instructions of the dispatcher.

(The CSUB police tip line is a monitored voice message system that allows anyone to leave tips on crimes or raise other concerns about campus safety.)

In Person Contact:

- The CSUB Police Department is located in Building 60, north of Roadrunner Drive, north of the Icardo Center turnaround and next to Science III.

Emergency Blue Light Call Stations (Bakersfield Campus)

- A 24-hour, button activated, emergency telephone system will put you in contact with emergency personnel for any emergency need. There are over 47 call stations located throughout the CSUB campus, including residential housing.

SPECIAL SAFEGUARDS FOR FACILITIES OR ACTIVITIES

Security of and Access to Campus Facilities

The CSUB Police Department and the campus community share responsibility for the locking and unlocking of all campus facilities.

The campus is secured in accordance with established procedures while routine janitorial services are performed during the night hours. The CSUB Police Department has the final responsibility for securing all facilities at the close of business each day and during holiday or seasonal days off. Residence Halls are

accessible by key card or for the resident rooms and buildings in Student Housing East and key for the resident rooms in Student Housing West.

Campus facility access may be revoked per Penal Code 626.

Security Considerations Used in Maintenance of Campus Facilities

Regular inspections and surveys of campus indoor/outdoor lighting, shrubbery and walkways are conducted. The University participates in crime prevention through Environmental Design concepts for planning and improvements on campus.

Special Event Safety Planning

Preparation for large events on campus involve creating Incident Action Plans in accordance with the Standardized Emergency Management System and in collaboration with mutual aid agencies and contracted safety personnel.

New Student Orientations

University Police personnel provide personal safety tips and emergency contact information to new students on a regular basis. Students are informed of policies, voluntary confidential crime reporting procedures, and safety programs.

New Employee Orientations

Throughout the year University Police personnel present safety policies and procedures to new employees, in cooperation with the Human Resources department. Employees are informed of injury and illness prevention, workplace violence, safety programs, and voluntary confidential crime reporting procedures.

ACTIONS IN THE LAST 18 MONTHS TO INCREASE SAFETY

- Increased the number of cameras on campus.
- Increased foot patrol by officers.
- Active shooter training provided to staff and students.
- Increased patrol staffing levels
- Lights surveys conducted to improve the lighting on campus
- Increased indoor emergency notification speakers
- Emergency Management training provided to staff
- Revised the Emergency Operations Plan
- Coffee with the Cops program continued

CHANGES IN SAFETY PRECAUTIONS DURING THE NEXT 24 MONTHS

- Continued Rape Aggression Defense courses offered for students
- Continued improvements to the emergency notification system (Visiplex)
- Continued Emergency Management training
- Implementation of the new Emergency Operations Plan
