During the month of October, CSUB's Todd Madigan Gallery will host a free exhibit of some of the world's most extraordinary ancient Egyptian artifacts from the Phoebe A. Hearst Museum at UC Berkley. The exhibit, called "*The Art of Death in Ancient Egypt*," will be stunning display providing our OLLI & community members a rare glimpse of ancient Egyptian treasures.

OLLI members may listen to a lecture by Dr. Robert Yohe, an Egyptologist & CSUB professor of Anthropology, on **Thursday Oct. 8th 2:00 p.m. in the Dore Theatre**, enjoy some refreshments, and then enter the exhibit. "*The Art of Death*" exhibit explores the fascinating evolution of funerary practices through Egyptian history by showcasing items specifically created for the afterlife. The collection's centerpiece features a stunning hand-painted sarcophagus dating back to the 3rd Intermediate Period, circa 945–712 B.C. Other items such as a child mummy and sarcophagus and Coptic period children's tunic truly make this exhibit a once in a lifetime experience.
