- “Medieval Art”** By Dr. Shelley Stone **Mon. & Wed. Sept. 14 - Nov.25 5:20 p.m. - 7:25 p.m.**
-The development of the Medieval schools & styles of art & architecture in Europe from the 3rd - 15th century.
This is a main campus class. Course location: TBD
- “Poetry”** By Dr. Marit MacArthur **Mon, Wed, Fri. Sept. 14 – Nov.25 10:55 - 12:15 p.m.**
- Studies form, structure, & themes of poetry by poets from around the world & across the centuries. Readings in the criticism of poetry & practice in writing poetic analysis. **This is a main campus class. Course location: TBD**
- “Abnormal Psychology”** By Dr. Anne Duran **Tues. & Thurs. Sept. 15 – Nov. 25 10:55 - 12:15 p.m.**
- Examination of theory & research concerning abnormal behavior, from psychiatry, psychology, sociology, & other disciplines. Implications for treatment & prevention. **This is a main campus class. Course location: TBD**
- “American Indian History”** By. Dr. Douglas Dodd **Tues. & Thurs. Sept. 15 – Nov. 25 9:30 - 11:35 a.m.**
- The history and culture of Native Americans north of Mexico, from the colonial period to the present. The course will address cooperation and conflict in relations between Indians and Euro-Americans, as well as Native American cultural persistence and adaptation. **This is a main campus class. - “Jazz Appreciation”** By Dr. James Scully **Tues. & Thurs. Sept. 15 – Nov. 25 12:20 - 2:40 p.m.**
- Introduction & examination of characteristics, techniques, styles, terms, and methods found in the jazz tradition. This examination will include critical issues related to the social & cultural history of African-Americans & how that history influenced the creation of the music. **This is a main campus class. - “Wrongful Convictions”** By Dr. Peggy DeStefano **Fri. Sept 18th 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.**
-The top 10 reasons innocent people go to prison. Over the past several years, hundreds of wrongfully convicted persons have been released from penitentiaries throughout the U.S. Several of these individuals were sentenced to Death Row. Join us in a workshop designed to examine the reasons why innocent persons get convicted of crimes they did not commit. We will also explore what mechanisms are in place to right the wrong they have suffered at the hands of the American criminal justice system. **Course location: BDC 401C**
