**University Background**: CSU Bakersfield, founded in 1970, is a regional, comprehensive university serving the southern San Joaquin Valley of California. CSU Bakersfield's service area covers nearly 25,000 square miles and is home to a socially and ethnically diverse population of over 11,000 students. CSU Bakersfield is the only fouryear degree granting institution within a 100-mile radius. Due to this, CSU Bakersfield has a vital role in educational obtainment, economic development, and quality of life within the region.

The accolades CSU Bakersfield has received include Third Way's #5 Most Economic Mobility Index (2022), Washington Monthly's #13 Best Bang for the Buck for Western Colleges and #26 Best Master's University nationwide (2022), Best Value Schools' #21 Most Affordable 4-Year Colleges (2022), and US News and World Report's #25 Top Public School in the West (2022).

CSU Bakersfield serves 9,800 undergraduate students and 1,400 graduate, credential, and post-baccalaureate students. 63.5% of CSU Bakersfield's students are Hispanic/Latinx, 21.5% are Caucasian, 7.1% are Asian, 4.9%

are African-American, 2.3% are multiracial, 0.5% are American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 0.2% are Hawaiian/Pacific Islander. CSU Bakersfield is a federally designated Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI).

**Department Information**: The Department of Political Science is a dynamic and collaborative community composed of professors, staff, and students who engage current events and the political world in and outside of the classroom. We are a department focused on undergraduate students that is located in the School of Social Sciences and Education. Currently, faculty expertise ranges from American Politics, the Law, International Relations, World Politics, and Political Theory. We teach courses in various areas such as Religion and Politics, Civil Rights and Civil Liberties, Judicial Politics, Legal Reasoning, Immigration Politics, and the Politics of Mexico among others we have developed. Located in the heart of California's central valley and the birthplace of farmworker labor protests and activism. The Department of Political Science is committed to assisting the university become truly inclusive through our commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion. We adhere to these principles in order for our current and future students to become active agents of change for their communities and our world.

**Position Description**: The Department of Political Science at California State University, Bakersfield invites candidates to apply for a Tenure-Track faculty position in American Politics with a focus on Environmental Politics, Sustainability and Justice. Among the topics of interest that should be focused on are climate change, global warming, and energy politics, agricultural and industrial environmental pollution, water politics and policy, homelessness, migration – locally and across various regions of the country and world, and America's global environmental footprint – with special attention to people from marginalized communities.

The Political Science Department is small but thriving – it is home to a robust Pre-Law Program, and a Model United Nations Program among others. The Department's student demographics are 70% women, and a substantial percentage of First-Generation students, and recently Forbes Magazine ranked CSUB 18th as Top Performer on social mobility. Furthermore, CSUB is a great location for anyone who is interested in studying what politics and policy looks like at the intersection of ethnorace, class, and an ongoing climate crisis. CSUB is located in Kern County which is over 60% Latinx and considered both an agricultural and oil and gas hub. The Central Valley is also the second- most pumped aquifer system in the U.S. We are located one hour and thirty minutes north of the Hollywood Bowl. One hour and 20 minutes from the Central California Coastal Wine Country, and one hour and 40 minutes to the state's central coast. Kern County is where more than 250 different crops are grown and where approximately 75% of California's irrigated land is located. A scholar professor would not only be able to conduct vital research for and about the region on the topics of water and agriculture, but Kern County is also known for its involvement with oil and gas making CSUB a fruitful location to also study energy policy.

As a department, we are looking for a qualified and committed candidate with a PhD (ABDs may be also considered) in American Politics with an emphasis in Environmental Politics, Sustainability and Justice (Public Policy, Political Economy, Policy and Politics are encouraged to apply) who can develop and teach courses that are reflective of our community, issues, the state of California, and the US public policy making process. Additionally, candidates for the position would be expected to teach the department's Core Courses, Research Methods, and Introduction to American Government among others.

- Earned a Ph.D. (ABD with degree completed before start date) in Political Science, from an accredited doctoral-granting institution.
- Demonstrated commitment to teaching undergraduates from diverse socioeconomic, cultural, and academic backgrounds, including first-generation students.

- Teaching experience using a variety of teaching modalities (in person, synchronous, asynchronous).
- Possess a commitment to promote equity and inclusion through teaching, research, and service at CSUB.
- Evidence of Scholarship/Research
