California Water Awareness Campaign Scholarship - FAH (Vol. 7, No. 34)

Students are advised that the California Water Awareness Campaign (CWAC) Water Scholar 2006 program will provide at least two \$2,500 scholarships to applicants who demonstrate an interest in the water field.

PURPOSE - To provide economic support to graduating high school and junior college students who exhibit an interest or are actively pursuing a career in the water industry. Each year, the California Water Awareness Campaign (CWAC) grants two scholarship awards in the amount of \$2,500 each.

AWARDS - Each winner will receive a check for \$2,500 made out to the name of the chosen institution. The award can be used for tuition or the purchase of books and class materials.

ELIGIBILITY - Any senior high school or junior college student entering or attending an accredited four-year college or university in California and who is exhibiting an interest or is pursuing a career in the water industry is eligible. Award recipients are selected without regard to race, color, creed, gender, handicap, age or national origin.

REQUIREMENTS - Applicant must be a California resident. A completed application form and the following documents will be accepted by the Scholarship Program Committee each year between November 15 and March 15.

- High School and/or Junior College transcripts
- Two (2) letters of recommendation: Letters of recommendation must be written within the last six months and contain the name of the applicant, comment on the applicant's character and abilities, and an opinion of his/her ability to profit from a college education. A parent/guardian or close relative CANNOT be considered as a reference. The name and occupation of each person writing a letter is required.

If any of these documents are missing, the application will not be considered.

DEADLINE - The scholarship application must be submitted by *March 15, 2006*.
