### 1. Double Major

#### 2. Art

- ART 302 or equivalent (may be taken at a community college);
- A studio ART course selected from: ART 212, ART 213, ART 214, ART 216, ART 303, ART 304, ART 310, ART 403, ART 404 or ART 410 (or transferred equivalents);
- An upper division course in Art History selected from the following: ART 381, ART 382, ART 383, ART 384, ART 388, ART 390, ART 478, ART 483;
- ART 402 (the prerequisite for this is ART 302) or an upper division studio art course.

### 3. Child Development

- CAFS 200;
- One course selected from the following: PSYC 310 or SOC 366;
- One course selected from the following: CAFS 311, CAFS 312, CAFS 313, CAFS 350 or CAFS 280;
- One course selected from the following: CAFS 320, CAFS 360, CAFS 430, CRJU 340, CRJU 345, CRJU 380, SOC 364, PSYC 320, PSYC 323, PSYC 411, PSYC 412, PSYC 413, PSYC 415 (all of the PSYC 400 level courses have PSYC 310 or instructor's permission as prerequisite).

### 4. Children's Literature

Four courses chosen from each of the following categories, as specified:

- One course selected from: ENGL 101, ENGL 235, ENGL 290, ENGL 294 or ENGL 295;
- Three courses selected from: ENGL 470, ENGL 471, ENGL 472, ENGL 473, SPAN 422(all of these courses have prerequisites), THTR 307, CAFS 280.

### 5. Children's Theatre

One course from each of the following categories.

- One course selected from: THTR 232, THTR 233, THTR 241 or THTR 251;
- THTR 305;
- THTR 307 (prerequisite is THTR 305);
- THTR 405 (prerequisite is THTR 305)

### 6. Communications

### 7. Diversity and Pluralism in US Society

Select four courses, one in each category. One course may be lower-division. No course may be double-counted to satisfy two areas.

- Latino, Asian or Native American: ANTH 252, CRJU 330, CRJU 345, HIST 468, RS 365, SOC 335, SOC 336, SOC 338 or SPAN 425;
- Gender: ANTH 438, COMM 360, CRJU 325, EEGS 381, ENGL 370, ENGL 375, FREN 425, FREN 426, HIST 462, INST 205, NURS 327, PEAK 430, PHIL 381, PSYC 421, SOC 365, THTR 381;
- Diversity Studies: ANTH 339, BEHS 435, CAFS 320, COMM 370, CRJU 430 (prerequisite CRJU 240), EEGS 381, ENGL 420, PHIL 382, PSYC 340, PSYC 442, SOC 327.

### 8. Ethnic Literature

### 9. Health & Wellness

**Only one of the courses used for the concentration may be double-counted for another major requirement.**

- ENGL 362, ENGL 363, ENGL 370, ENGL 373, ENGL 375, ENGL 391, ENGL 392, ENGL 393, ENGL 395, ENGL 396, ENGL 469, ENGL 470, ENGL 471, ENGL 472, ENGL 473, ENGL 475, THTR 307, THTR 381, THTR 385.

### 11. Linguistics

Four courses chosen from each of the following categories, as specified.

### 12. Mathematics:

### 13. Music

One course from each category, to total at least 19 quarter units:

- Any combination of the following to a maximum of five units: MUS 132-134, MUS 227-229, MUS 231, MUS 232, 233, MUS 236, MUS 250/450, MUS 251/451, MUS 253, MUS 254, MUS 256, MUS 249/449, MUS 249/449.
- MUS 310
- MUS 330

### 14. Natural Sciences

- Complete four courses in natural sciences, of which at least two must be in the same discipline (Biology, Chemistry, Geology or Physics and at the majors level). These courses must include at least one upper division course, and total at least 19.5 quarter units. N.B. No course in this concentration can be double-counted elsewhere in the major.

### 15. Physical Education
