This degree track is for the student who wants a general and non-specialized course of study that provides some knowledge of a broad range of subjects in the Arts and Sciences, but who does not plan to become a Multiple Subjects teacher. General Track majors complete all of the requirements for Graduation from CSUB. Courses may not be double counted in the core requirements. One course may be double counted in the core and in the depth of concentration area (or the minor). Courses completed with a grade of 'D' may be used in this option, but the student must remember that a minimum grade point average of 2.0 is required for graduation. **(FYI: Students will need 180 units to graduate with this degree; including 60 upper division units) (Transfers: 75 units at a 4 year university; 45 units must be at CSUB; 36 units upper division) (Four (4) courses can be double counted)**

12. Mathematics:

  - b. Two other Mathematics courses at the 100 level or above, not including MATH 221, Math 320 and Math 321.
13. Music

One course from each category, to total at least 19 quarter units:

  - a. MUS 101, MUS 111, MUS 120, MUS 122, MUS 201, MUS 202, MUS 390
  - b. Any combination of the following to a maximum of five units: MUS 132-134, MUS 227-229, MUS 231, MUS 232, 233, MUS 236, MUS 250/450, MUS 251/451, MUS 253, MUS 254, MUS 256, MUS 249/449, MUS 249/449.
  - c. MUS 310
  - d. MUS 330
14. Natural Sciences
  - a. Complete four courses in natural sciences, of which at least two must be in the same discipline (Biology, Chemistry, Geology or Physics and at the majors level). These courses must include at least one upper division course, and total at least 19.5 quarter units. N.B. No course in this concentration can be double-counted elsewhere in the major.
15. Physical Education
  - a. PEAK 345 Elementary School Physical Education (5 units)
  - b. Two of the following: PEAK 300 (4 units), PEAK 305 (4 units), PEAK 325 (5 units), PEAK 340 (5 units), PEAK 400 (5 units).
