## About CSUB Nursing

The pre-licensure BSN program is for students with no previous nursing experience and requires approximately 1 year of pre-requisite courses and 3 years of focused nursing courses. Upon successful completion of the program and general education coursework, students will earn a BSN degree and will be eligible to apply for the California RN licensure exam. Enrollment into the 3-year program is contingent upon formal acceptance through the general application process.

Graduates of the BSN program are:

- · Qualified to apply for a CA Public Health Nursing Certificate
- Prepared to test for the CA RN license
- Prepared to enter a master's program in nursing or related field

## Career Opportunities in Nursing
