

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

FIRST-TIME FRESHMAN

FRESHMAN ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

First-time Freshman Requirements:

- 1. Have a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 2. Complete the 15-unit "A-G" college preparatory courses with grades of C or better prior to high school graduation. Grades of "credit/pass" in 'A-G' courses completed in 2020 (winter, spring, summer, and fall) and 2021 (winter and spring) will also be considered to fulfill A-G requirements.
- 3. Earn a minimum, overall 2.5 GPA in all A-G requirements (CA Residents).

Note: Non-residents must have a 3.0 GPA or greater.

A-G Requirements:

A. HISTORY/SOCIAL SCIENCE- 2 YEARS REQUIRED

One year of world history and one year of U.S. history or one-half year of U.S. history and one-half year of civics or American government.

B. ENGLISH - 4 YEARS REQUIRED

English composition and literature.

C. MATHEMATICS - 3 YEARS REQUIRED, 4 YEARS RECOMMENDED

Acceptable courses include Algebra I, Algebra II, geometry, and other advanced courses that require algebra and geometry as prerequisites. Computer programming courses do not fulfill the math subject requirement.

D. LABORATORY SCIENCE - 2 YEARS, 3 YEARS RECOMMENDED

One year of biological science and one year of physical science. Both must have a labortatory requirement. Acceptable courses include Biology, Chemistry, Physics, etc.

E. FOREIGN LANGUAGE - 2 YEARS REQUIRED

Two years of the same language other than English. American Sign language is approved.

F. VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS - 1 YEAR REQUIRED

One visual and performing arts course selected from visual, art, dance, drama/theatre, or music.

G. COLLEGE-PREPARATORY ELECTIVE - 1 YEAR REQUIRED

An approved college preparatory A-G subject course.

TRANSFER ADMISSION

TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Transfer Student Requirements:

- 1. Complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester or 90 transferable quarter units.
- 2. Complete with a grade of C- or better the Golden 4 requirements:
 - A1 Oral Communication
 - A2 Written Communication
 - A3 Critical Thinking*
 - B4 Mathematics/Quantitative Reasoning

Note: *Applicants applying in engineering majors (Computer Engineering, Electrical Engineering and Engineering Sciences) do not have to complete Critical Thinking prior to admission.

- 3. Have a minimum, overall GPA of 2.0 or higher in all transferable units attempted (CA Residents only).
- 4. Be in good standing at the last college or university attended.
- 5. Complete a minimum of 30 semester or 45 quarter units in courses approved to meet CSU General Education (GE) requirements.

Note: CSUB will accept undergraduate applications for non-impacted programs from lower-division transfer students for the Spring semester ONLY.

FINANCIAL AID

The California State University is among the most affordable four-year public institutions in the nation. About 90% of CSUB's students received some form of financial aid during the 2022-2023 academic year.
