Cognitive Representations of Social Categories

- *Social Perception and Subjective Definitions of Social Categories* Exploring subjective definitions of the social categories “race,” gender (incl. transgender), and sexual orientation and their relationships to social judgments (e.g., impression formation) and attitudes

Prejudice, Discrimination and Stereotyping Processes

- *Prejudice and discrimination* Assessing attitudinal and behavioral biases toward racial, sexual orientation, and gender (incl. transgender) groups
- *Stereotyping and correlates of bias* Examining how mental representations of social categories—in terms of variability, exclusivity, mutability, definition emphasis—influence stereotype content, prejudice and discrimination processes

- *Prediction/Forecasting* Exploring the mental construction of possible futures (“what might be”), its underlying processes and its relationship to social judgments and affective processes
- *Counterfactual Thinking* Exploring the processes underlying thoughts about “what might have been” and their relationships to forecasts
