# **INTRODUCTION**

California State University, Bakersfield is committed to powering economic change, community development and social growth across the southern San Joaquin Valley and beyond. CSUB is where Roadrunners rise to shape their futures and those of their families, empowered by the transformative education provided by a dedicated and passionate community of faculty and staff.

## **SCHOOLS**

#### Arts and Humanities - *Maiors that matter*.

The School of Arts and Humanities provides students with broad artistic and humanistic knowledge while increasing skills that are useful for a variety of professions. The school has seven departments and nine academic programs, and also regularly offers concerts, exhibitions, guest lectures, and performances for the university and the community.

#### Business and Public Administration - *Majors that mean business*.

The School of Business and Public Administration leads the region with undergraduate and graduate degree programs, preparing leaders trained in current theory and practice. We offer five bachelor's degree programs: agricultural business, economics, environmental resource management, public administration and business administration, which offers 12 concentrations including accounting, entrepreneurship, finance, human resource management, management, marketing and supply chain logistics. In addition to an MBA, offered in person and online, we provide an MPA program and a MS in Health Care Administration, all designed for working professionals. Accredited by AACSB and NASPAA, the school powers the region's economy and develops leaders for the future.

## Natural Sciences, Mathematics and Engineering - *Majors that work*.

The School of Natural Sciences, Mathematics and Engineering provides students with hands-on research and field practice opportunities that help them succeed after graduation. With millions of dollars in federal grants and scholarships, state-of-the-art facilities and brand-new degree programs, the school is on the cutting edge of science, engineering and health care education that empowers the regional economy and enhances the well-being of Kern county residents.

## Social Sciences and Education - *Majors that make a difference*.

The School of Social Sciences and Education offers undergraduate, graduate, credential and professional degree programs that prepare students for careers in education professions, health and wellness, civic engagement, community advocacy, human and social services, law enforcement and legal professions. The school has forged strong partnerships with local school districts, criminal justice agencies, non-profit groups and other organizations to enrich the quality of life in the region.

### **Academics**

Academic excellence and a commitment to building a vibrant social and economic future for our students is at the core of everything that we do at CSUB. We are passionate about supporting and educating students and inspiring them to become knowledgeable, engaged innovative and ethical contributors to this region and the global community. CSUB provides a host of resources dedicated to making sure all students have the resources they need to excel.

## Diversity

CSUB is committed to diversity, equity and inclusion. The university aims to uplift, validate and support students of all backgrounds. CSUB provides programs and initiatives such as the Multicultural Alliance and Gender Equity Resource Center (MAGEC), Dreamers Resource Center, Veterans Success Center and services for students with disabilities.

# **Extended Education and Global Outreach (EEGO)**EEGO offers online and hybrid bachelor's completion degrees, master's degrees and

professional certificates designed for adult learners who want to improve their earning potential and have a more fulfilling life. Additionally, EEGO is home to the Study Abroad and Fulbright programs, which seek to enrich the university experience for main campus students.

## Sustainability

At CSUB, being sustainable means reducing waste, using water responsibly, being energy efficient, using sustainable transportation, promoting green jobs and more. To address food insecurity, CSUB offers a number of options for students, including the Food Pantry and fruits and vegetables from the Edible Garden. In 2018, CSUB ranked Silver in the Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS) for its commitment to reducing its environmental impact.

## **Walter Stiern Library**

The 150,000 square-foot building houses nearly half a million volumes and provides electronic access to hundreds of thousands of periodical titles and over a million ebooks in almost 200 databases. Faculty and staff have access to materials from across all 23 campuses of the California State University via OneSearch and CSU+.
