

CSUB Resources

Counseling Center 654-3366

Offers free mental health counseling to registered students. Counselors are available Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. Common issues that may prompt a referral are sexual identity concerns, depression, anxiety, stress, romantic relationship problems, family relationship problems, sexual assault, physical assault, grief, suicidal thoughts, and feelings of isolation.

Ombudsperson 654-2417 Humanities Office Building 227

Dr. Maria Paleologou, a professor in the department of philosophy and religious studies, is the current Ombudsperson for CSUB. The Ombudsperson is available to meet with any student who has a concern or complaint about the University. The Ombudsperson serves to facilitate dialogue between students and the University when help is needed to resolve a disagreement or a misunderstanding. She does not impose solutions but acts as a neutral mediator in problem-solving and conflict resolution.

Health Center 654-2394

The Health Center provides basic outpatient medical services for the diagnosis and treatment of acute and sub-acute conditions, illnesses and injuries. The medical staff is available for routine health care, women's services, minor surgery, and urgent care including basic x-rays, laboratory and pharmacy. The Health Center provides information on contraception, safer sexual practices, STD testing and counseling, and immunizations.

Health Educator 654-2394

Lauren Ash-Anderson is currently the Health Educator Assistant on campus, and her office is located in the Health Center. The Health Educator is trained to help students understand the health issues most important to them, ways to prevent health conditions and diseases, and tools to cope with health related issues as they arise. Nutrition, exercise, drug and alcohol abuse prevention, sexual health education, and sexually transmitted disease education are among the topics addressed by the Health Education Dept.

Campus Police 654-2111

The University Police Department is a full-service law enforcement agency that is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The University Police Department investigates crimes that occur on campus and assists other local law enforcement agencies. If a student has been assaulted, is being harassed, or in general, believes they are in danger, the police should be the first campus agency contacted. The officers can provide information regarding legal issues, serve as liaisons to other law enforcement agencies, can provide emergency restraining orders, and will provide escort services on campus if a student feels unsafe.

Director of Equity, Inclusion, and Compliance 654-2713

Markus Brown, J.D., is the campus Discrimination, Harassment and Retaliation Administrator and Title IX Coordinator. He investigates complaints of alleged discrimination in regards to disability, gender/sex (including gender identity and gender expression), nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, age, and military/veteran status. He also investigates incidents of sexual violence (sexual assault, rape, domestic/dating violence, and stalking) when they occur on campus or may involve our students, faculty, or staff and coordinates a response on behalf of the University. He is available to meet with students, faculty, or staff who have a complaint regarding alleged discrimination on the campus.

Vanessa Corona, the campus advocate, provides individualized, compassionate and confidential emotional and decision-making support to CSUB students, staff and faculty who have experienced sexual misconduct. The Campus Advocate is available to provide advice and assistance, such as resources and options available to the victim/survivor. This includes accompaniment and explanation of law enforcement, legal, and medical processes. The Campus Advocate may serve as the victim/survivor's advisor and assist in seeking additional services. The Campus Advocate provides culturally sensitive services to individuals from all cultural backgrounds, sexual orientations, and gender identities.

GST 1400: Gay/Lesbian/Bisexual/Transgender Issues

This course provides an introductory exposure to gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender issues through online discussions. Each semester a new topic of importance to gay/lesbian/bisexual/transgender individuals will be presented.

PSYC 3638: The Psychology of Sexual Orientation

The purpose of this course is to incorporate information from a variety of different fields (e.g., history, sociology, biology) to address psychological issues relevant to sexual orientation. In this course, students will critically examine attitudes, assumptions, and research regarding straight, lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgendered people. Topics will include the development of gender and sexual orientation, historical views of sexual orientation, differences between individuals with different orientations, progression and change in orientation throughout the lifespan, social/legal policies regarding sexual orientation, and stereotypes and discrimination of individuals with particular orientations.

SOC 4400: Gay & Lesbian Experience in the US

Lesbian/gay studies; personal, political, economic, historical and cultural issues, including: coming out, hate crimes, law, military, marriage, families, religion, activism, community, representations in literature, film, and media.

SOC 2400: Sex and Gender Issues

In this course we will examine a variety of gender issues affecting personal, social, educational, and work lives. Topics to be discussed during the course will help students explore the influence of gender in shaping our lives, our attitudes, and behavior. We will also study how people shape and challenge gender in significant ways leading to various forms of social change. Throughout this process, key concepts such as race, social class, and sexual orientation will be integrated in the examination of gender.
