Call for Student Writers, Poets, Graphic Novelists & Illustrators

Kern County Library, CSU-Bakersfield, and Bakersfield College are excited to launch the first Native Literary Mentorship Program in conjunction with the 2025 One Book Project. The purpose of this program is to lift-up native voices with professional guidance on crafting and publishing their work. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to be professionally mentored by successfully published Native American Authors, Editors, and Illustrators.

Currently enrolled student writers, poets, graphic novelists, and illustrators with a tribal affiliation are encouraged to apply to be paired with a published Native American author for a 1-hour one-on-one Zoom session scheduled in November to receive personalized feedback on your creative work and discuss your publishing goals. Additionally, ALL applicants will be invited to the initial 1-hour Introductory Q & A Zoom session with EACH founding mentor!
