

Homelessness in Kern County

- Overall homeless 2020: 1,580
- Change in homelessness since 2019: +19%
- Change in homelessness since 2018: +50%
- Sheltered homeless: 374
- Homeless Individuals: 1,359
- Homeless People in Families: 220; +14%
- Chronically Homeless: 4; +0.3%



Demographics of Homeless Population


Age Gender





- Low Barrier Navigation Center

City of Bakersfield

- Measure N
- Impact Unit (Bakersfield Police Department)
- Contracts w/ Bakersfield Homeless Center (Job Development)
- Low Barrier Shelter
- Expanding Capacity of existing shelters







Basic Needs at CSU Bakersfield

Prevalence Rates

- CSU System-wide (Crutchfield & Maguire, 2018)
- 41.6% students who reported food insecurity in the past 12 months
 - 20% low food security
 - 21.6% report very low food security
- 10.9% students who reported being homeless or at risk for homelessness at least once in the past 12 months
- CSU Bakersfield: 40% of CSUB students, staff, and faculty reported experiencing food insecurity (Hegde, 2013)

Food and Housing Insecurity Outcomes

- Students report lower GPAs and greater academic stress (Crutchfield & Maguire, 2018)
- Students are more likely to drop classes, struggle with concentration (Dubick et al., 2016)
- Students are less likely to participate in co-curricular activities (Henry, 2017)
- Higher levels of depression and anxiety (Eisenberg et al., 2007)

Food Pantry



- Open to students, staff, and faculty
- M,W,F 10 am 2 pm
- T, TH 2 pm 6 pm
- Point system (16 pts./ week)
- Items are designated with point values (1,2, or 3)

Food Distribution

- Approximately 250 households served per month
- Open to community
- Every 3rd Monday of the month from 10 a.m.-12 p.m.(Except Jan. & Feb.)
- Emergency Distribution (Since April 2020)
- Volunteer Opportunity



CalFresh Application Assistance

- Program that can help households buy healthy foods.
- Nationally, the program is called SNAP.
- CalFresh benefits are issued on an EBT card that works like a debit card and can be used at most grocery stores and many farmers markets to purchase food.




Housing Assistance

- On-campus Emergency Housing
 - If student qualifies, Residence Life can provide emergency accommodations.
 - During that time, we will work to connect the student to the appropriate resources for sustainable housing.
