University Background: CSU Bakersfield, founded in 1970, is a regional, comprehensive university serving the southern San Joaquin Valley of California. CSU Bakersfield's service area covers nearly 25,000 square miles and is home to a socially and ethnically diverse population of over 11,000 students. CSU Bakersfield is the only four-year degree granting institution within a 100-mile radius. Due to this, CSU Bakersfield has a vital role in educational attainment, economic development, and quality of life within the region.

The accolades CSU Bakersfield has received include Third Way's #5 Most Economic Mobility Index (2022), Washington Monthly's #13 Best Bang for the Buck for Western Colleges and #26 Best Master's University (2022), Best Value Schools' #21 Most Affordable 4-Year Colleges (2022), and US News and World Report's #25 Top Public School in the West (2022).

CSU Bakersfield serves 9,800 undergraduate students and 1,400 graduate, credential, and post-baccalaureate students. 63.5% of CSU Bakersfield's students are Hispanic/Latinx, 21.5% are Caucasian, 7.1% are Asian, 4.9% are African-American, 2.3% are multiracial, 0.5% are American Indian/Alaskan Native, and 0.2% are Hawaiian/Pacific Islander. Position Description: CSUB is looking specifically for a dynamic person with knowledge, skills, and abilities to work cooperatively with faculty in delivering the current curriculum and offering additional research opportunities to serve more effectively an ever-increasing number of undergraduate majors and graduate students, representing a diverse student body in a culturally diverse community. Teaching assignments may include, but are not limited to, the following existing courses — Exercise Physiology, (including Advanced and Clinical versions), Exercise and Aging, Exercise Prescription, Nutrition for Sport and Performance, and Measurement and Evaluation in Kinesiology. In addition, the department seeks an individual willing to explore new teaching strategies including online instruction and be willing to teach in our Master of Science program. As a tenure-track Assistant Professor, the candidate must develop, within a normal 6-year probationary period, a sustained record of teaching success, research and scholarship (especially involving students), and professionally related service to the Department, University and local community to justify the award of tenure and promotion to Associate Professor.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Ph.D. (ABD with degree completed before start date) in Exercise Physiology, or closely related field, from an accredited doctoral-granting institution.
- Demonstrated commitment to teaching undergraduates from diverse socioeconomic, cultural, and academic backgrounds, including first-generation students.
- Evidence of, or potential for, a productive research program.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Record of undergraduate teaching success broadly, but specifically in Exercise Physiology courses or similar to Exercise Physiology, Advanced Exercise Physiology, Clinical Exercise Physiology, Exercise Prescription, Nutrition for Sport and Performance, Epidemiology and Wellness, and Measurement and Evaluation in Kinesiology.
- Demonstrated commitment to professional and scholarly activity (extramural funding desirable).
- Experience supervising/mentoring undergraduate and graduate students.
- Knowledge and awareness of professional developments related to areas of expertise and the field of kinesiology.

Application: Nominations are welcomed and encouraged. Complete applications require the following six (6) items:

- Original and personalized letter of application addressing the above qualifications and responsibilities
- Current vitae.
- Copy of university transcripts verifying academic record and award of doctorate (or anticipated award for ABD)
- Copy of publication, submitted manuscript, or professional writing sample
- Names and contact information (mailing address, email address, and office telephone number) for at least three professionals familiar with your teaching and scholarship record
- A statement of contribution to diversity, equity and inclusion. The statement should include information on how the applicant currently or will potentially promote diversity, equity and inclusion through their teaching, research and service at CSUB.

Please send completed applications to the search committee chair at the address listed above. The **Search Committee** will begin reviewing completed applications on or soon after the closing date and will continue until the position is filled.

Compensation: Commensurate with experience and qualifications. CSUB offers a generous benefit package (e.g. excellent health, dental, vision, and retirement benefits).

Background Check: A background check (including a criminal records check) must be completed satisfactorily before any candidate can be offered a position with the CSU.
