Application Deadline Date: April 13, 2018. Open until filled, but applications completed by the deadline will receive fullest consideration.

Description: This is a non-tenure-track position at the rank of Lecturer. Appointment is for one year and may be renewed for additional years based on satisfactory performance and funding availability. Salary is competitive and commensurate with the experience and qualifications. This assignment may include teaching five days a week, including early mornings, afternoons and/or evenings.

Other Duties: maintaining subject matter currency; developing and revising curriculum; using computer and multimedia technologies; assessing student learning; and participation in discipline-specific professional activities.

Qualifications: Master's degree or higher in Communication, Speech, Speech Communication, Communication Studies, or Rhetoric from a regionally accredited college or university. Experience teaching oral communication (public speaking) courses, at the college level.

Preferred Qualifications: Two or more years of teaching oral communication (public speaking) courses, full-time (or equivalent), at the college level, as the instructor of record. Experience working with a diverse/multicultural student body and/or workforce. Commitment to ongoing professional development in the field of communication, general education, communication pedagogy and/or higher education pedagogy. Experience with course/program assessment.

Background Check: A background check (including a criminal records check) must be completed satisfactorily before any candidate can be offered a position with the CSU. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the application status of applicants or continued employment of current CSU employees who apply for the position.

Mandated Reporter: The person holding this position is considered a "mandated reporter" under the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act and is required to comply with the requirements set forth in CSU Executive Order 1083 as a condition of employment.

Compensation: Commensurate with experience and qualifications. CSUB offers a generous benefit package (e.g., excellent health, dental, vision, and retirement benefits.)

Application: The complete application package must include: 1) cover letter; 2) curriculum vitae with evidence of effective teaching; 3) statement of teaching philosophy and teaching portfolio; 4) three letters of recommendation; and 5) a sample syllabus.
