Department Information:

The History Department offers Bachelor's and Master's degrees in History, while also providing courses that serve the needs of other programs, including Liberal Studies and the Subject Matter Program in Social Science (California Teacher Credential Program). Eight full-time and several part-time faculty teach a wide range of courses covering fields from the Americas to the Middle East, and Africa to Asia, serving about 120 majors and 20 graduate students, as well as General Education students. The department is enhanced by the university library's History Research Center, as well as its History Forum (speaker series), the History Newsletter, the History Research Group and the Public History Institute, and fosters intellectual development, academic achievement, and collegiality among students through the History Club, Phi Alpha Theta, and the Women's History Group.

General Information:

California State University, Bakersfield, founded in 1970, is one of twenty-three campuses of the CSU System and currently has an enrollment of over 8,800 students. The University services a socially and ethnically diverse population of 800,000 in an area of 10,000 square miles. The city of Bakersfield (population over 350,000) is located in the southern San Joaquin Valley and has a much lower cost of living than coastal California. Los Angeles, the Pacific Ocean, Mojave Desert, and Sierra Nevada Mountains are all within a two-hour drive from campus.

Deadline: Review begins November 15, 2017. Open until filled, but applications completed by November 15, 2017, will receive fullest consideration.

Qualifications: Applicants must have a Ph.D. in European History. A secondary field in the Middle East, Africa, Digital History, or Historical GIS (Geographic Information Systems) is desirable and most welcome.

Responsibilities: The successful candidate will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses in his or her field of study and departmental service courses. In addition, candidates should also be prepared to help develop and teach courses in cross-disciplinary studies and engage in distance/online instruction. Candidates will also be expected to participate in appropriate levels of service to the department, school, the university, and the profession.

Background Check: A background check (including a criminal records check) must be completed satisfactorily before any candidate can be offered a position with the CSU. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the application status of applicants or continued employment of current CSUB employees who apply for the position.

Mandated Reporter: The person holding this position is considered a "mandated reporter" under the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act and is required to comply with the requirements set forth in CSU Executive Order 1083 as a condition of employment.

Compensation: Commensurate with experience and qualifications. CSUB offers a generous benefit package (e.g. health, dental, vision, and retirement benefits).

Application: The complete application package must include 1) cover letter, 2) curriculum vitae with evidence of a clear research program leading to publication, 3) statement of teaching philosophy and teaching portfolio, and 4) three letters of recommendation.
