Application Deadline Date: Review begins October 30, 2019. Open until filled, but applications completed by October 30, 2015 will receive fullest consideration.

Description: Applications are invited for a tenure-track position in African American History, with a secondary field in gender desirable, at the assistant professor level, beginning approximately August 15, 2020.

Qualifications: Applicants must have a Ph.D. in African American history, and a secondary field in gender is desirable. Teaching: The successful candidate will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses in her or his field of study and departmental service courses. In addition, the candidate will participate in appropriate levels of service to the department, school, the university, and the profession.

Background Check: A background check (including a criminal records check) must be completed satisfactorily before any candidate can be offered a position with the CSU. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the application status of applicants or continued employment of current CSU employees who apply for the position.

Mandated Reporter: The person holding this position is considered a "mandated reporter" under the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act and is required to comply with the requirements set forth in CSU Executive Order 1083 as a condition of employment.

Compensation: Commensurate with experience and qualifications. CSUB offers a generous benefit package (e.g. health, dental, vision, and retirement benefits).

Application: The complete application package must include electronic copies of 1) a cover letter, and 2) a curriculum vitae, with evidence of a clear research program leading to publication. Letters of recommendation and a teaching portfolio will be solicited from candidates at a later date. Please email application materials to the search committee chair, listed above.
