- 1. The meeting was convened at 3:10
- 2. Committee members introduced themselves.
 - a. Debra Jackson is part of the WASC Leadership Institute and has undertaken a project to assess our new GE program.
- 3. John Tarjan will take notes.
- 4. Timeline, including our own summer schedule and initial MOU discussion
 - a. Carl distributed a calendar illustrating how little time we have to get courses proposed before faculty leave for the summer.
 - b. He reviewed the curriculum conversion/information system tasks.
 - c. The timeline is tight for many departments to submit courses for the new GE program.
 - d. Are there resources for faculty to develop GE courses during the summer?
 - e. Courses can continue to be entered into the system beyond the initial cut-off dates. But there will be a delay during which no courses can be added.
 - f. We need to be able to advise students on how to finish which means we have to have approved courses in the system.

- i. The possibility of funding during the summer for department curriculum meetings was discussed.

 - b. Convening of faculty advice groups was discussed
 - c. We have work that has already been done on SLOs by courses/areas
 - d. It may be desirable to develop some preliminary outcomes and requirements for review by faculty
 - e. Foundational-skill reinforcing courses, theme courses, and GRE courses will require the most faculty input since they are "owned" by the university to a greater extent than existing area, etc. courses.
 - f. Foundational skills and capstone should be the focus of programmatic assessment
