- ➤ <u>Crafting a Compelling Resume</u>: Wilson, a self-proclaimed "conveyor of knowledge," stressed that a resume should tell a story and convey a clear message. He highlighted the importance of networking and noted that a resume is often the first impression an employer has of a candidate.
- Experience Matters: When hiring, Wilson prioritizes experience. He believes that education showcases discipline and the ability to persevere, while experience demonstrates what can be done with that education.
- ➤ <u>Honesty is Key:</u> "Do not lie on a resume," he repeated, underscoring the importance of integrity.
- ➤ <u>Precision and Conciseness</u>: Resumes should be precise and concise, demonstrating detail and impact beyond basic job descriptions.
- ➤ <u>The Power of Keywords:</u> With hiring managers spending an average of 7.4 seconds reviewing a resume, using relevant keywords is crucial.
- ➤ <u>Additional Tips:</u> Proofreading, proper grammar, job specificity, and the use of buzzwords are essential for a strong resume.
