Application Fees

Application fee—Every school is different. From the rare no-fee application to \$200 or more.

Most application fees fall into the \$50 to \$85 range.

Current Testing Fees-GRE \$220 GMAT \$275 in person/\$300 online

LSAT \$215

ALWAYS contact the school to see if they offer application waivers. Look into reduced testing fees/waivers as well!

*Estimate your costs and budget ahead of time

Actual Out of Pocket Costs

Published Tuition Rates can be misleading

ALWAYS find out what your Out of Pocket costs will be.

FAFSA or Dream Act

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each year

OR

The California Dream Act Application

Applications open October 1st and the priority deadline for California is

March 2nd

Types of Aid

Scholarship- Funds you do not need to repay, usually require an application. Can be merit based or need based

Grant- Funds you do not need to repay, usually need based

Fellowships- Awards that graduate students or postgraduate scholars typically compete for. Fellows are selected based on their potential to make a positive, long-lasting contribution to their academic discipline

Assistantships or Work Study- Funds earned through work opportunities

Loans-Federal and Private



Types of Aid at CSUB

Federal Student Aid Programs

- Graduates/Professionals \$20,500 Unsubsidized Loan
- Credential students \$5500 Subsidized (plus \$7000 unsub for Independent students) Pell Grant if eligible, Federal TEACH Grant, Golden State Teacher Grant, Middle Class Scholarship
- Federal Work Study (FWS)

State Aid Programs

- State University Grant (SUG) up to \$7176 Grad, \$6660 Cred
- MBA Grant (For those charged MBA fees-\$270 / unit)
- Several new state grants for Credential students

Fellowships

- Graduate Equity Fellowship
 - CSUB Awards typically range from \$500 \$3,000

Types of Aid

- Grants- Will vary by State
- Scholarships/Fellowships/Assistantships- Will vary by School, Program and Major.

Receiving Aid as a CSUB Graduate Student

- Complete FAFSA or California Dream Act Application
 - Submit all requested documentation
- Admissions
 - Be admitted to campus & at least conditionally admitted to program
- Enrollment
 - Must be enrolled in at least 3 graduate-level units (half time status.
 - 6 units for Credential students
- Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)
 - Must be meeting guidelines of 3.0 GPA and passing at least 67% of attempted units or have approved petition
- Optional, but recommended: Direct Deposit
 - Sign up through your MyCSUB (CSUB Student Portal)



Cash Course Online Tool

- CashCourse | Your Real-Life Money Guide
- Online financial education courses through instructor assignments or self-study
- Customizable financial tools such as worksheets, a Budget Wizard, quizzes and calculators
- A personal dashboard to track your progress
- Articles and resources on topics that students can relate to
- A guide to real-life money question
