Program Overview

The RN to BSN Program at California State University, Bakersfield offers new windows of opportunity for professional growth. Health care is rapidly expanding and evolving daily. Advancements in in-patient care and the accompanying technology has made the need for quality, highly educated nurses greater than ever. The Bachelor of Science in nursing (BSN) degree is increasingly recognized as the degree that properly prepares nurses for the current healthcare environment. The BSN program gives nurses the needed skills in critical thinking, leadership, case management, and health promotion. Upon completion of the program, graduates will be eligible to apply for a Public Health Nurse (PHN) certificate that permits work in either public health or school nursing and various community-based organizations.

A new cohort will be accepted each fall semester. The RN to BSN Program is an on-line program; however, a full on-campus orientation day (date TBD) and 90 on-site clinical hours in Community Health are required. Upper-Division General Education courses may also require on-campus attendance.

120 semester units are required to graduate with the BSN. Students will complete Upper-Division General Education coursework during the program at CSU Bakersfield. Students must be formally admitted to the RN to BSN Program and admitted to CSU Bakersfield to enroll in nursing courses. Courses must be taken as scheduled.

Eligibility Requirements

To be considered for admission, students must meet the following criteria. Documentation showing that all requirements have been met must be included in your completed RN to BSN Program application:

- Graduate of a nationally recognized, regionally accredited Associate Degree program in nursing.
- Current, clear, and active California RN License and American Heart Association Healthcare Provider CPR card. (Students may apply while in progress).
- Must have at least a grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or greater in the last 60 semester/90 quarter units of course work.
- Prerequisites (To be completed by the December prior to the start of the program with a grade of C or better):

o Anatomy o Statistics

o Physiology o Public Speaking

o Microbiology o Advanced English Composition

o Chemistry o Critical Thinking

- Be in good standing at the last college or university attended.
- Meet all CSUB Department of Nursing new student requirements upon admission including Essential Functions (See Undergraduate Handbook under "General Information").
- Be accepted to CSU Bakersfield.
- Submission of a completed RN to BSN Program application through NursingCAS.
- Recommended: Completion of all General Education Coursework by the Spring Semester prior to starting the program.
- Recommended: Meet with the RN-BSN Program Advisor to review your eligibility.
