Thank you for your interest in the MSW program at California State University, Bakersfield!

The CSUB MSW program is fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). The CSUB Social Work program offers enrollment to qualified students during the fall term only. Please see the programs of study at http://www.csub.edu/socialwork/Curriculum%20Guides/index.html for the sequence of courses.

The application for Fall 2024 will become available on **October 1, 2023, and** will close on **February 16, 2024**. All applications will be reviewed <u>after</u> the deadline.

MSW PROGRAM PREREQUISITES

- 1. A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.
- 2. A GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4-point scale in the last 60 semester units or 90 quarter units attempted is preferred. A GPA from 2.5 to 3.0 may be considered, at the department's discretion. **If the GPA is below 3.0**, please attach a separate page with your application explaining why you believe your application should be considered despite the low GPA. Applications with a GPA below 2.5 <u>will not be</u> considered.
- 3. Proof of Writing Proficiency Requirement (see below)
 - Fall 2024 applicants must complete the MSW Writing Exam by 2/15/24.
 - The MSW Writing Exam is proctored at the CSUB Testing Center weekly on Mondays through Thursdays at 9am, 10am, and 2pm. Contact the Testing Center to schedule an appointment to take the exam: Office: 661 654-3373; Email: testingcenter@csub.edu

MSW APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS (1-7)

- 1. **Apply to the University:** before the Department of Social Work can consider an application for the MSW program, the University must first receive an application for admission to the University. Apply to the University via https://www2.calstate.edu/apply and pay the \$70 graduate application fee.
- 2. **Complete Department application:** for Admission to the Master of Social Work program on the web page at https://www.csub.edu/socialwork/, Under "In this Section" > Social Work Admissions > Admissions Materials
- 3. **Submit 3 Reference forms:** obtain the Reference Form from the Master of Social Work program web page at: https://www.csub.edu/socialwork/, Under "In this Section" > Social Work Admissions > Admissions Materials.
 - Fill out the top portion of the form and send to three individuals who can provide a reference for you. Once they are completed, please have your recommender directly submit your form to the following email: mswadmissions@csub.edu
 - Please note that computer literacy is expected. At a minimum, students should be able to retrieve electronic documents online according to prescribed procedures. *Applicants who complete and return the application will be considered to have met the computer literacy requirement.*
- 4. **Obtain a set of sealed original transcripts** from **ALL colleges and universities attended**. Students and graduates of CSUB may skip this step. Transcripts need to be submitted electronically directly from the institution. They can be sent electronically either to the Office of Admissions incomingtranscripts@csub.edu or the Department of Social Work at mswadmissions@csub.edu
- 5. **Submit a Resume:** using one section for employment history (paid experience) and another section for volunteer history (unpaid experience). Provide a summary of your experiences during the **last six years** that relate to the broad field **of human services and education**. <u>Please do not include other items on your resume</u>. List the items in reverse chronological order (most recent first.)

For each experience identify:

1. Name of the organization

- 2. Was the organization either a government agency, not-for-profit, or for-profit
- 3. Community where you worked/served
- 4. Dates of service
- 5. Typical number of hours each month
- 6. Summary of the duties you performed

6. Employment/Volunteer Verification Letter:

For each experience include a signed letter of verification. Each letter should be signed by the approve person at your agency and should include:

- 1. Agency address.
- 2. Agency name.
- 3. Agency dates.
- 4. Employee job title.
- 5. Employee job description.
- 6. Employee current salary.
- 7. Employee Rehire Eligibility Status
- 8. Name and job title of the person signing the form
- 9. Reason for termination

7. Submit Proof of Writing Proficiency Exam:

Complete the MSW Writing Exam through the CSUB Testing Center before 02/15/24.

To prepare for the Exam, review the below prompt. Applicants will write a response to this prompt during their exam.

Provide a personal statement that describes your interest in social work. Your essay shall be *two pages double-spaced* (using 1-inch margins and 12-point Times New Roman Font) and should address the following:

- Significant personal, academic, and /or professional factors influencing your decision to pursue a Master of Social Work degree.
- Relevant personal, academic, and/or professional experiences, qualities, and/or abilities that will contribute to your overall success as a graduate student and in the social work profession.
- Your career goals, commitment to social change (or justice), and interest in particular social work issues, including specific populations.
- Specific reasons CSUB Department of Social Work is a good fit for your educational and professional goals.

All application materials must be received by February 16, 2024, by 11:59pm. **Incomplete and late applications will be reviewed only at the department's discretion.** Applicants must complete each item in the application packet. Write N/A (not applicable) in any spaces that do not apply—do not leave any items blank. The Department plans to conclude the notification process in April 2024. Additional admissions may be granted after that date if space becomes available.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

There are three programs of study within the MSW program:

- 1. Full-time, two-year program with primarily day-time classes (Tuesdays and Thursdays) and day-time field placements (Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays)
- 2. Part-time, three-year program with hybrid classes in the evening (Tuesday or Thursdays) and day-time field-placements during the weekdays
- 3. Advanced-standing full-time, one-year program with primarily day-time classes (Tuesdays and Thursdays) and day-time field-placements (Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays)

Applicants will be considered for admission to only one of the three programs.

Note that electives for all students and all classes for part-time students will include face-to-face and online components at least one evening per week and a hybrid component on another weekday evening. Other courses may also include face-to-face and online components.

ADVANCED STANDING

To be eligible for Advanced Standing, students must have met ALL the following requirements:

- 1. All the requirements for a master's degree must be completed within seven years. Therefore, all BSW courses that will count toward the MSW degree must have been taken within seven years of completion of the MSW Program.
- 2. The BSW must be earned from a program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education.
- 3. Overall GPA of 3.0 or better
- 4. Grade of B or better in all social work courses

Advanced Standing students waive foundation year requirements of the MSW Program.

FINANCIAL AID for students in the Master of Social Work

All students needing financial assistance are encouraged to apply for financial aid via the CSUB Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships. Please note that students are required to spend twenty hours per week in a field placement for three semesters (two semesters for advanced-standing students) while in the MSW program and that field placements are normally available only from about $8:00~\mathrm{AM}-5:00~\mathrm{PM}$ Monday through Friday.

All participants in the Title IV-E CalSWEC Program incur an obligation to work in public child welfare – normally a County Child Welfare Department – for one calendar year per year of support received.
