Ride a Bike

The Student Recreation Center's (SRC) Runner Ride bike share program allows students, staff, and faculty free daily access to a fleet of 30 bicycles.

Register your bicycle with CSUB University Police and receive a free U-Lock! UPD provides a bike registry sticker which will ensure your bicycle can be identified and returned in the event it is stolen and recovered.

• Take the Bus

CSUB offers 50% off monthly Golden Empire Transit to students, staff, and faculty. Bring your CSUB ID to the Cashier's Office to buy one today!

Carpool

Carpool to school, to events, or for an offcampus lunch. To find carpools, try the Waze phone app's carpool function. Visit www.commutekern.org for free ride-matching and commuter benefits!

• Electric Vehicles

CSUB's Lot M features 4 electric-vehicle (EV) charging stations at \$1.25 per hour for the first 4 hours and \$2.50 for each hour thereafter.

• Clean Air Vehicle Parking

Clean Air Vehicles (electric and plug-in hybrids) can find preferred parking in Lot A2 in front of Humanities, and Lot K3 near Housing East.

Use a Reusable Water Bottle

We have over 30 water bottle refill stations available throughout campus. Remember your reusable water bottle and never pay for drinking water again at CSUB.

• Bring Your Own Coffee Mug

The Walter Stiern Library & Starbucks offer discounted coffee to those who bring their own mug.

Stay on Campus

Save the gas and improve air quality by eating at one of many on-campus eateries. Or bring your lunch and reheat it using the public microwaves located at Panda Express and Runner Express.

• Skip the Straw

Say no to single-use plastic. When ordering, politely decline plastic drink lids, bags, single-serving coffee creamers, plastic coffee stirrers, and other single-use plastics.

Monthly Food Distribution

CSUB Housing and Food Security Committee and Community Action Partnership of Kern (CAPK) partnered to provide monthly emergency food assistance on campus. Anyone can attend the food distribution which is held on the third Monday of each month.

CSUB Food Pantry

Students, staff, and faculty can visit the CSUB Food Pantry to receive free food items – each person is allowed one visit per week. Please bring your own shopping bag. The Pantry, located north of the Student Union, also provides hygiene products. The Pantry also accepts donations year-round.

Pop-Up Pantry

Stop by every Monday, in front of the Food Pantry, to receive free fresh produce. Please bring your own shopping bag.
