The Jackson Interagency Hotshots (JIHC) are seeking highly motivated and qualified crew members -

The JIHC is the only Bureau of Land Management fire resource based east of the Mississippi River and 1 of 4 IHC's in the Southern Geographic Area.

The JIHC is an organization dedicated to increasing diversity for underrepresented populations in land-based agencies while maintaining the highest level of safety and professionalism.

Based out of Pearl, MS—the crew responds to wildland fire, as well as national disaster incidents across the nation. Season typically starts in March through September with critical fuels reduction projects/RX opportunities and training opportunities before/after (based on National/Local partner/agency need).

POSITION TITLE: Wildfire Landscape Management Intern

POSITION SUMMARY: In partnership with the Mt. Adams Institute (MAI) and AmeriCorps, the Umatilla National Forest is offering this exciting opportunity that combines hands-on work experience, skill development and camaraderie. VetsWork GreenCorps Interns will receive US Forest Service (FS) training in safety, chainsaw, tool use, wildfire landscape management, wildland firefighting, and crew organization. Interns will focus on wildfire fuels reduction (thinning and removal of excess trees/vegetation) combined with wildland fire training. The experience and training in the VetsWork GreenCorps program is designed to prepare participants for a variety of positions with the U. S. Forest Service. Participants of the program who perform satisfactorily during the service term have an opportunity to be hired directly onto a Forest Service fire (hand) crew immediately after the internship.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS (TO INCLUDE, BUT NOT LIMITED TO):

- Support the Integrated Vegetation Management Plan by participation in fuels reduction. A large part of the position will involve "thinning"- using a chainsaw to thin trees in designated areas on the forest to mitigate the build-up of wildfire fuels.
- Participants will attend basic "Fire School" where they will receive training and certification in the following courses:
 - I-100 – Introduction to Incident Command System (ICS)
 - L-180 – Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service
 - L-280 Followership to Leadership
 - S-130 – Firefighter Training
 - S-190 – Introduction to Wildland Fire Behavior
 - S-211 – Portable Pumps and Water Use
 - S-212 – Wildland Fire Chain Saws
 - S-219 Firing Operations
 - Forest Service Defensive Driving
 - First Aid/CPR
- Participate in trail construction and facility maintenance as needed.
- Attend and complete all MAI/AmeriCorps trainings and service requirements including orientation, trainings and team meetings.
- Complete and submit all necessary MAI/AmeriCorps paperwork and reports in a timely manner.
- Wear MAI identifiers and required safety gear while performing service or attending official events.



Boise National Forest Temporary Timber Positions for the 2022 Field Season Forestry Technician (Timber Sale Prep) GS-0462 – 03, 04, 05, 06 Emmett and Idaho City

Forestry Technicians are an integral part of the forest timber program. The work they perform leads the way towards the planning and implementation of active forest management within the forest. They are required to work independently, and as a member of a production-oriented team. The work is both demanding and rewarding.

Duties:

Timber Sale Prep

- Selects and marks individual trees for harvest using well defined marking guidelines, silvicultural prescriptions, and specific instruction.
- For 3-p sampling, estimates individual tree volume by established methods.
- Traverses harvest units, processes information, and produces maps.
- Designates sale area and cutting unit boundaries on the ground.
- Interprets Aerial Photos and locates ground features.
- For timber cruising, serves as tally person and may operate electronic field data recorders. Assists in the measure of limiting distances, tree diameter, tree height, estimation of defect and quality, and related fundamental timber cruising procedures. Timber cruising is done under the direct supervision of a qualified timber cruiser.
- Observes and reports areas of possible archeological significance, and sightings of sensitive, threatened, or endangered wildlife species.
- Participates in other aspects of resource management support work such as recreation, maintenance, silviculture, tree planting, etc.
- Performs other duties as assigned.
- This position will require the individual to work and stay at other duty stations within the forest at times.

Housing: Some housing may be available. Check with contact person at the duty station.

COVID Updates

The deadline to turn in Vaccine and/or Vaccine booster information is February 28th. People who are late may find themselves locked out of Canvas.

If you choose to be exempted, you will need to be tested for COVID-19 on a weekly basis. The testing site is the Stockdale room at the Runner Café. The testing site is open from **7 am – 7 pm Monday – Thursday, and 8 am – 12 pm on Friday, walk-ins welcome.**

The testing is a saliva test, **DO NOT** eat or drink anything an hour prior to testing.

IF YOU TEST POSITIVE you will be asked to quarantine for 5 days. If you are asymptomatic, by the end of those 5 days you can test again, if the test is negative, you may return to campus.
